Financial Successes:

- Envelopes & Offertory continued to exceed budgeted expectations that were set somewhat conservatively coming out of the pandemic.
- Higher school enrollment boosted Tuition & Fees above budget and prior year.
- Generous bequests and other donations benefitted the parish and school. The new parish endowment fund now stands at \$106,000.
- We received just over \$180,000 in funds from the Love One Another campaign allowing us to start making some much-needed improvements and upgrades.

Financial Challenges:

- Repairs and maintenance expenditures on facilities and equipment exceeded budget as we
 work to ensure a safe and comfortable environment for learning and worship.
- Inflationary pressures have started to increase costs and will have to be monitored closely.

Letter From Our Trustees

Dear St. Joseph Parish Family,

What a difference a year makes! It is difficult to list all the changes we've seen in the past 12 months, but we'll highlight a few.

- Our church has successfully lifted all restriction and we are free to meet and worship face to face.
- We've wished happiness, peace, and success to our departing leadership team of Fr. Steve, Fr. Mike and Brenda Cline.
- We joyously welcomed Fr. Nick into our parish family.
- Deacon Scott Wiese became our Director of Administration upon the retirement of Jay Frymark.
- Shari Hansen took on several important roles due to the retirement of Ken Stanczyk and the transition from Brenda to Fr. Nick.
- We went on our first Work Camp in 3 years!!

One thing we've learned from science is that change is stressful—and a lot of change is very stressful. We're extremely grateful for the calming leadership of our parish staff and our countless volunteers. They showed us the way to engage in our faith and parish during these tumultuous times.

For the second year in a row, we closed the books with a surplus of revenues over expenses. This is possible only with careful management of expenses, strong student enrollment in the school, and the generosity of our parishioners. Everyone participates in the financial stability of our parish. This year we started an endowment fund. The fund is a financial repository for gifts and memorials that are not designated for other purposes. As the fund grows it will produce a steady stream of income to the parish and its missions.

We are pleased to announce that the Love One Another capital campaign pledge drive has concluded. The number of SJP families that participated was exceptional. Overall pledges totaled over \$1.2 million dollars, of which \$720,000 will come back to St. Joe's. We've begun receiving our portion of your pledges from the Archdiocese. The projects we identified at the beginning of the campaign are now being financed.

If the health of the parish can be predicted by the health of our school, then the parish is in great shape. School enrollment continues to grow. Our Extended Care and Pre-K are almost at capacity. School fundraisers continue to receive wide support. In looking ahead, we're excited at the prospect of in-person Lenten fish fries and increased opportunities for fellowship.

We close this letter by offering a huge thank you to our parishioners. None of the above accomplishments can be possible without you. We see you living our mission as the 'hands of Christ' every day. We notice your generosity of time, talent, and treasure. We feel your love and friendship at Mass and in the community. We will have challenges and changes next year. We're certain our faith and friendship will carry us through.







Enriched Curriculum

In addition to the standard curriculum, SJPS continues to offer valuable instruction that many schools have eliminated due to budget constraints. Our students not only learn math, reading, science, social studies, and religion, but also music, handwriting/cursive, technology, art, physical education, and Spanish as part of the weekly curriculum. Students enjoy our large library, piano lessons, and field trips. We continue to offer STEM, athletics, band, choir, and our annual musical in grades 5th-8th. Additionally, we provide 1:1 technology of iPads or Chromebooks and advanced math and language arts opportunities.





Exceptional Students

SJPS educated 147 students from grades K3-8 during the 2021-2022 school year. The students grew in faith, knowledge, leadership, service and discipline. Testing through the NWEA MAPS in 2021 of K5-8th graders gave these impressive results:

- 66% of SJPS students demonstrated High or High Average level of achievements in Mathematics.
- 67% of SJPS students demonstrated High or High Average level of achievement in Reading.





Strong Moral Values and Daily Exposure to the Catholic Faith

As part of our mission, St. Joseph Parish School gives back to the community, nation, and world through monthly service projects. In 2021-22 we filled 14 Thanksgiving Baskets for the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry to share with our neighbors in need. We also created handmade bags of Valentines to share with nursing homes and elderly neighbors in Grafton to brighten their days! Our students also collected donations of hygiene products, household necessities and small gifts for mothers and fathers for Los Toros, our Sister Parish in the Dominican Republic.

In addition, our Middle School Students conducted over 400 hours of community service including helping at the Kapco Christmas Toy Drive, delivering food to food pantries, making sandwiches for St. Bens, and helping neighbors with yard work or other duties.

Field Trips-students visited the Catholic Ecology Center, First Stage Theater, Milwaukee Public Zoo, American Family Field, Mequon Nature Center, Pioneer Village, Ozaukee Human Society, Milwaukee Public Museum, The Schauer Arts Center, and the Pumpkin Farm.

SJPS received renewed accreditation from The Wisconsin Religious and Independent Schools Accreditation. WRISA accredits schools that meet rigorous standards of excellence and demonstrate continuous school improvements. SJPS was recognized for:

- A focus on differentiation to meet individual learning needs, especially regarding advanced math opportunities.
- Excellent collaboration with our Parish.
- Strong curriculum review process and school-developed documentation.
- Clear evidence staff devotes time to improve student learning and develop new initiatives.
- Students see the faculty as role modes of Faith.
