St. Joseph Parish experienced a healthy 2023-24 fiscal year. We extend our sincere thanks for your steadfast stewardship and support of our parish mission, "The Hands of Christ...Open to All". For 175 years, our parish family has had an uninterrupted Catholic presence in Grafton, having a strong connection to the community, as we continue to invite all to grow in faith. We reflect upon all who have come before us and those resting in our St. Joseph and St. Francis Xavier Cemeteries, including several dozen whose graves, until recently, were unmarked. Now, permanently marked and still known only to God, we know they too helped write the St. Joseph Parish story.

We are committed to responsible use and care of our buildings and grounds, and extend our gratitude for your tireless stewardship.

We expect Fr. Tim to move into the new space in the coming weeks.
