

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This past weekend we celebrated All Soul's Day. It is a day where we remember and pray for those who have died, especially our family and friends. While praying for the dead has long been found in the tradition of the Church, recent times suggest we may have fallen out of practice of this beautiful and necessary act of charity.

It is a strange thing to do, to pray for the dead. After all, what are we actually praying for the dead to obtain? The answer to this is based on the reality of Purgatory. Purgatory, another tradition that we do not speak much of today, is real. But what exactly is it?

To understand this we need to be aware that purgatory is not necessarily a place but a process. Even here on earth, we are called to live a life of purgatory. The word purgatory means to purify, or in other words, to achieve the holiness necessary to enter heaven. Purgatory is a process which prepares us for heaven.

When understood this way, purgatory is not just something for those who have died, but for all us living as well. All of us can be striving to prepare ourselves for heaven. However, as we know in our own life, we do not always take advantage of the time afforded to us here on earth. In fact, I can spend very little time preparing for heaven and rather spend a lot of time preparing for life on earth.

To account for this, God gives us additional time after we die so that we can "make up" the time we may have wasted on earth. That's a pretty good deal; that God gives us even more time to prepare for heaven if we need it. That said, we may be tempted to ask why do we need to prepare for heaven at all?

My favorite way of explaining this is with a sports analogy. For those of us who played sports, we quickly become aware of how we compare to our teammates and opponents. For example, I did not play basketball until I entered into seminary. Many of the seminarians had played basketball for many years. I quickly became aware of how poorly I played basketball compared to these men. I felt like I did not belong.

However, since I did not want to be the weak link and hurt my team, I devoted additional time to learn the game and increase my skill. While I never was the star on the team, I no longer felt like I was holding the team back.

The relationship between heaven and purgatory is similar. If I were to die right now and go straight to heaven, I would immediately feel as if I do not belong because there are many things I am still attached to here on earth. Even if I am free from sin, there are still sins I have the desire to commit. I would feel as if I was the "weak link" as I stood among all the saints who completely entrusted their life to God. If we are honest, we know that even our loved ones who have died were not perfect. To account for this, God gives us the training ground, the process of purgatory.

Purgatory prepares us for a spot on the team, the team of heaven. When we pray for the dead, we are praying that this process may go quick. That they may "practice", purify, prepare, themselves for heaven as fast as possible. We are acting as cheerleaders in a way, encouraging and helping them.

When thought of in this way, purgatory does not seem all that bad or scary, in fact it is a great thing for it allows us to experience the full joy of heaven.





The St. Joseph St. Vincent de Paul Conference has quietly been aiding neighbors in need in Grafton since 1981.

Below is listed how, with your generous donations of money and goods, our members were able to aid neighbors in need during our last fiscal year (10/01/2023 - 09/04/2024).

- 14 active members visited neighbors in need and attended SVDP meeitngs. 29 associate members helped with special events and went on occasional visits.
- \$20,792 was donated by parishioners like you.
- \$20,008 was provided from our SVDP Thrift Store from the sale of your donated goods.
- 305 in-person and phone visits were conducted with neighbors in need.
- \$11,191 was provided to neighbors in need to assist with food, transportation, and utility bills.
- \$26,570 was provided to neighbors in need to assist with rent and temporary housing.
- \$1,629 was provided to neighbors in need to assist with school shoes and school supplies for 35 kids.
- We also provided referrals to other agencies that may be able to help neighbors in need, such as Family Promise, Salvation Army, Advocates, Ozaukee Food Alliance, Wisconsin Emergency Rental Assistance (WERA), etc.
- 86 SVDP Thrift Store vouchers were provided to neighbors in need for clothing, furniture, household goods and toys.
- 33 gift cards were provided to neighbors in need for Thanksgiving food, which were donated by parishioners like you and the parish school
- 164 Christmas gifts, donated by parishioners like you, were delivered to Grafton neighbors in need and their families.
- 52 Christmas gifts, donated by parishioners like you, were delivered to kids at the Milwaukee SVDP Meal Sites.
- 30 Christmas gifts, donated by parishioners like you, were delivered to the Women's Care Center.
- 220 bags of food from our pantry were provided to hungry neighbors in need.
- 837 hours were donated by our members in support of conference activities
- 3125 miles were driven by our members in support of conference activities.
- \$2,400 was given to our domestic twinning partner, St. Catherine's SVDP conference, in Milwaukee.
- \$600 was given to the Milwaukee SVDP to help other needy conferences.
- \$1,200 was given to the SVDP Meal sites in Milwaukee.
- \$2,400 was given to our international twinning partner, Los Toros SVDP conference, in the Dominican Republic.
- \$300 was giving to St. Lawrence Seminary to pray for deceased St. Joseph parishioners.


