## Statement of Financial Activity Cont.



During the 12 months ended June 30, 2025, the Parish had a very solid financial year. Stewardship from parishioners saw an increase of 6.3% over the prior year and continues to be alive and well at St. Joseph Parish.

Our school continues to live out its mission as the Hands of Christ Open to All. Through its participation in the Parental Choice program, welcoming students with a variety of special needs, and growing our early childhood program, our school continues to be a gift to our parish and wider community.

During the year, we finished with an operating surplus of nearly \$70K. The combination of committed donors and school families coupled with fiscal discipline has helped us achieve this result.

Beyond our standard operating budget, we have also invested in our parish and school. We installed a PA system to enhance our security, replaced aging boilers, and welcomed Fr. Tim to his new home in our renovated Rectory. Funds raised through your generous commitment to the Love One Another Campaign have made these projects come to life. We continue to discern the best use of these funds in our parish, on our grounds, and for our cemeteries.

What a way to cap off 175 years of the Catholic Church alive in Grafton, Wisconsin!

We give thanks to the Lord for His many blessings -- our parishioners, our financial stability, growth in our parish, and faith to carry on His mission.

## Letter from our Trustees

SAINT JOSEPH PARISH

Our past 2024-25 church year has been a year of transition and a year of hope. This year we welcomed a trifecta of Pastoral leaders at all levels of the Catholic Church. Just a few months ago, many anxiously awaited the white smoke and announcement "Habemus papam!" – "We have a pope!" Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Prevost of Chicago, Illinois and the first North American born elected pope.

Not too long before that in January, we had a new Archbishop of Milwaukee, Jeffrey Grob, installed to shepherd our Diocese. Closer to home, we welcomed Fr. Tim Schumaker as St. Joseph Parish's Administrator and cheered at the announcement of Archbishop Grob that Fr. Tim was to be our Pastor. We look forward to the formal celebration of Fr. Tim's installation as Pastor this December. The impact of their service is already being felt, and we thank God for sending these men into our lives and pray for their strength and spiritual leadership in a very challenging world.

St Joseph Parish also saw several other pastoral and administrative changes in staff that impact a variety of aspects of Parish life. Andy Smith, Director of Music Ministry, took over the reins (or maybe more appropriately the piano/organ keys) from Bill Stevens. Lisa Jauron, our Business Manager, took over the books from Deacon Scott Wiese. And we have a team of talented individuals leading St. Joseph Parish School with the departure of our long-term principal, Amanda Matthews. We sincerely thank those who have been a part of writing the past story of St. Joseph Parish and we look forward to the many great things to come with our current leadership. Early in 2026 we will re-invigorate our search for a new school principal and continue to build on the past success of the important and inseparable ministry that is our Parish school.

This past year, we enjoyed the fruits of many months of praying and planning as we wrapped up the celebration of our 175th Anniversary with the dedication of our beautiful Holy Family Statue, with St. Joseph quietly displaying his usual strong leadership. We also celebrated the long-awaited conclusion of the Rectory renovation. These watershed moments and projects were made possible by the leadership of staff and Parish volunteers and through the generous donations of our Parishioners with funds raised as a part of the Love One Another campaign and direct donations. This past year we had the opportunity to thank Deacon Al Lazaga for his dedication in his Deaconate ministry and wish him well in his retirement. We also kicked off the St. Joseph Parish Knights of Columbus Chapter as we add another element to our outreach efforts.



These items go to organizations that support the needy, including Repairs of the Breach, Family Promise, McCannon Brown Center, and the House of Peace.



## Women's Group - \*\*\*New Ministry\*\*\*


