WEEKLY CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS By: Mr. Ciganek Art Teacher

During the month of January, in the elementary art classes students have been creating projects based on the theme of winter. K3 and K4 students drew cheerful snowmen and added bright watercolor backgrounds to their work, while K5 students and 1st graders experimented with tissue paper collage techniques in creating snow globe pictures. The story, "The Mitten Tree," served as inspiration for 2nd-grade mitten paintings that will soon be on display in the school hallway along with colorful cardinal paintings created by the 3rd graders. 4th-grade students are currently working on Pop Art cupcake drawings and paintings, and 5th graders are completing stained-glass style candle paintings. In middle school art classes, 6th graders are drawing portraits of each other, and 7th/8th graders are working on stained-glass-style paintings of the Holy Family. All artwork will be displayed at school upon completion.

To calculate the income of married families - take the total family income and subtract \$7,000, then compare that to the chart above. Example: If a family of 4 with parents that are married has an income of \$60,000, subtract \$7,000 and compare that amount (\$53,000) to the income limit for a family of four in the table above.

School Closing Due to Inclement Weather

Please review the following SJPS School Closing Policy regarding inclement weather from the Parent/Student Handbook.

St. Joseph Parish School is under the direction of the Grafton Public Schools regarding school closings due to inclement weather. According to Archdiocesan policy, it is recommended that a Catholic school close for inclement weather when the school's area public school closes. However, the principal may close the school if conditions may threaten the safety of students getting to school. When unsafe weather conditions require the closing of school, the superintendent of the Grafton Public Schools will notify the principal and local television stations by 6:00 a.m. Specific information about the closing of SJPS can be found through local broadcasts and the schoolwide communication system. If you contact the school, be aware that there may be limited staff to answer your call. In addition, when school is closed or dismissed early due to weather, all school-sponsored activities are also canceled.

Roses in the Snow by Dessi Jackson

Here is a read-aloud story for children and adults alike. Elizabeth loves to hear her grandmother's stories. But the story that touches her heart the most is the story of her namesake: St. Elizabeth of Hungary. St. Elizabeth's greatest-known miracle is called the Miracle of Roses. While she delivered bread to the poor, St. Elizabeth was accused of stealing

contents from the kingdom. When St. Elizabeth opened her cloak, a vision of white and red roses was seen, meaning she was under God's protection. So as grandmother and little Elizabeth prepare to celebrate St. Elizabeth's feast day, they joyously recall her holiness, devotion, and works of charity. The author, Dessi Jackson, tells the story in a way that transports one to another time and place while Lydia Grace provides beautiful watercolor illustrations that delight, especially the ones of roses.




The Beggar and the Bluebird by Anthony Destefano

One of my favorite authors has created another miraculous story to enchant the heart and soul. This is a sweet story of a little bird who keeps getting delayed in flying south because of the odd requests from a beggar on the street. This beggar has many jobs for the bluebird,

such as delivering bread to the homeless, giving money to the widow, and carrying a gold cross to a sick boy at the hospital. This kind-hearted bluebird is performing acts of mercy when he gets caught up in a massive snowstorm. When all seems lost, the beggar reveals who HE really is. This book teaches children the true meaning behind the giving of a gift and that great love

is noticed and rewarded by God. Exquisite illustrations by Richard Cowdrey complete this tale of magic.



The Fisherman's Tomb by John O'Neill

This is an incredible true story about the secret quest to discover the long-lost burial place of the Apostle Peter! Emperor Nero executed Peter in Rome, but his tomb, buried on Vatican Hill, had been lost to history. In 1939, workers beneath the Vatican unearthed an early Christian grave and discovered an unknown world, After that, an army of workers, funded by a

wealthy Texas oilman, began the archaeologist dig of a lifetime. This is an unbelievable and shocking story about the 75-year search for the tomb of St. Peter, the Fisherman. It has never been fully told until now and has all the elements of a great mystery, pitting the top Vatican insiders against a brilliant female archaeologist. It is a story of faith, courage, and triumph.
