**THE CALENDAR OF CASH! Coming Soon!** 



Dear St. Joseph Parish School families,

Fundraising is an integral part of keeping our tuition rates low and ensuring our students have the best resources available to them. Our main fundraiser has been the Spring Auction – a silent and live auction dinner held in May. The money raised helps keep our tuition rates as low as possible. I am pleased to announce St. Joseph Parish School is kicking off a new fundraiser called **The Calendar of Cash**.

What is The Calendar of Cash? A raffle ticket which includes 3 calendar months with cash drawing dates throughout each month. Prizes are \$25, \$50, \$100.

How does it work? All families are <u>required</u> to sell or purchase 10 tickets. Each ticket will sell for \$20. All tickets must be sold and turned in by January 2, 2024 (first day back after Christmas break). State law prohibits us from selling raffle tickets after the first drawing. We encourage you to turn in raffle tickets as they are sold. Please do not hold on to them as we want to make sure that none get lost or forgotten.

When does this take place? Starting November 17, 2023, you are being assigned 10 raffle tickets to sell or purchase for yourself. We would love for you to go above and beyond and sell more than 10! These 10 numbered tickets are linked to your families account. PLEASE DO NOT LOSE THEM.

**How can you help?** We encourage families to sell as many raffle tickets as possible! This will help cut down on the overall number of fundraisers that we do. When selling tickets PLEASE make sure the buyers name, address and phone number are on the ticket. This is how winners are contacted.

How much can you win? There will be 56 winners between January 2<sup>nd</sup> and March 22<sup>nd</sup> with prize winners receiving \$25, \$50 or \$100! Prize money totals \$3625. Winning tickets are **reentered** for more opportunities to win!

How do I know if I won? Winners will be notified by mail, publication in the SJP Bulletin, Lancer Times newsletter and SJPS Facebook page. Each winner will receive a check.

Who/Where can I sell these tickets to? Have your kids ask family, friends and neighbors. Don't forget babysitters/daycare, co-workers, outside clubs and social media.

## Weekly Classroom Highlights By Julie Lemke, 2nd Grade Teacher

In addition to becoming more fluent readers in second grade, it is also important to understand all structures of the story. In the month of October, our second graders were been busy working on a Pumpkin Character Book Report. For this project, they first chose a fiction book to read that was at their reading level. After reading the story, they identified who the main character was and wrote a five sentence paragraph describing that character. During this project, the second graders focused on the standards, or I can statements, listed below:

• I can demonstrate the command of conventions of standard English

- capitalization, punctuation, and spelling when writing.
- I can read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.
- I can identify characters and their traits.

When the reading and writing portion of this project was completed, they were then given the option to be creative and decorate a pumpkin to look like the main character from the story. These pumpkins were then displayed at our annual Family Fun Night Halloween event. Great job, second grade!
