

- Advertising Coordinator (assist with getting electronic and print promotions out to public/etc).



School Closing Due to Inclement Weather

Please review the following SJPS School Closing Policy regarding inclement weather from the Parent/Student Handbook.

St. Joseph Parish School is under the direction of the Grafton Public Schools regarding school closings due to inclement weather. According to Archdiocesan policy, it is recommended that a Catholic school close for inclement weather when the school's area public school closes. However, the principal may close the school if conditions may threaten the safety of students getting to school. When unsafe weather conditions require the closing of school, the superintendent of the Grafton Public Schools will notify the principal and local television stations by 6:00 a.m. Specific information about the closing of SJPS can be found through local broadcasts and the schoolwide communication system. If you contact the school, be aware that there may be limited staff to answer your call. In addition, when school is closed or dismissed early due to weather, all school-sponsored activities are also canceled.

Weekly Classroom Highlights By Mrs. Gratz, Middle School Math & Science Teacher

The middle schoolers have been hard at work this year in the science classroom. 8th graders focus on Life Sciences, including Ecology and Biology, 7th graders work on Physical Sciences, including Physics and Chemistry and 6th graders focus on Earth and Space Sciences. All grades recently completed research projects on their respective subjects.

As the 8th graders finished up their Ecology unit, they completed a research project on a chosen topic related to Human Impacts on the Environment. This project required research, writing, academic poster creation and an oral presentation. The focus was on the history of the issue, what happened/how it occurred, associated vocabulary and how the biogeochemical processes of the environments were disrupted. Some topics were the Exxon Mobil Oil Spill, Chernobyl, American Bullfrog Invasion, and the Great Pacific


Garbage Gyre.

The research project the 7thgraders worked on was related to Newton's 3 Laws of Gravity. Students were to become experts on one of the assigned laws. They were also required to research the material, create a digital presentation, note-taking worksheet and a review game, as well as give an oral presentation. Each presentation was to have both mathematical and real-world (relevant to 7th graders) examples of the laws being applied.

Lastly, the 6th graders kicked off their Exploring Space unit by completing a research project on one of the planets of our solar system. Students learned how to properly research for an academic topic using credible and reliable sources. They were also tasked with writing a 5-paragraph research paper on their planet that discussed the history, discovery, rotation, size, climate, atmosphere and other fun facts. Their project was wrapped up with an oral presentation sharing important details about their planet with their classmates.



DROP OFF & PICK UP REMINDERS

For everyone's safety & sanity, please make sure you are following these Care Line Procedures:

- Children in car seats can <u>ONLY</u> be dropped off or picked up using the car line option if you <u>PULL UP</u> to the far side of the car line <u>alongside the cones near</u> <u>the basketball hoops</u>. This way you are not blocking all of the cars behind you from getting out as you remove your child from their car seat.
- <u>DO NOT</u> walk through or in front of the car line to drop off or pick up your child. Anyone using sidewalk drop off/pick up <u>MUST</u> park on the <u>FAR EAST SIDE</u> of the parking lot and walk along the sidewalk <u>in front of the</u> <u>church</u> to drop off or pick up their child. This protects all of our children and families.
- Pull your car up as close to the car in front of you and then have your child enter or exit your car.
- Follow the directions of the faculty on duty and promptly pull up when they are waving you forward.
- <u>ONLY</u> use the route in the picture below for entering and exiting the line.


