

Weekly Classroom Highlights

Getting Ready to Read!

In our middle school classes, before we start a new classroom novel,

before we read the first sentence, before we even crack the cover, we prepare our minds by building our background knowledge so that we can get the most out of our reading experience. Sometimes this means learning about or reviewing historical events, discussing the genre's elements or having discussions about themes we'll encounter while reading. These activities are all designed to help the students get more out of the reading than just what happens.

The **6th grade** students are currently reading *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief*, but before the first chapter was read we were exploring Greek mythology. Each student selected a Greek god to research and write an informational piece about. Their task in the new year is to create a PowerPoint about their selected god to present to the class. Thus, as we read and encounter the different Greek gods, the students already have knowledge about that Greek god. We won't stop there. As we read we'll encounter a number of different mythological stories, which we'll pause our novel reading to learn more about.

In **7th grade** it's much the same. In the two weeks leading up to Christmas break we've been learning about Norse mythology. The students made posters about gods and creatures from Norse mythology that we'll encounter in the book and presented them to the class. However, the most interesting activity we did to prepare to read *Magnus Chase and the Sword of Summer* was to learn some sign language. Linda Hillebran, you may have seen her at church service before, visited our class and taught us how to sign the alphabet and other common signs. It was fun to see how eager the students were to learn about sign language and as an added bonus were quieter the rest of the day as they attempted to communicate with sign language.

Of course the same types of things are happening for the **8th graders**. After the new year they will be getting to read the classic *To Kill a Mockingbird*. They'll begin by exploring the historical time period in which the novel is set since it plays such a vital role. We'll also explore the theme of courage and what it means to be courageous. In tandem with the novel we'll be beginning our persuasive writing unit, which fits in perfectly as Atticus attempts to defend Tom Robinson. Throughout our reading we'll pause to dig deeper into the historical events of the time period, as well as look at other pieces of literature that are relevant to our understanding of the novel.
