January Counseling Corner

Weekly Classroom Highlights

It feels like winter has arrived! The days are shorter and the weather is getting colder and snow is here! The students are staying warm and working hard in middle school Social Studies and Religion. They are busy with activities and projects that are helping them grow in the understanding and knowledge of each subject.

The 6th Graders just completed the Ancient Egypt unit where they learned about ancient Egyptian culture and innovations. They learned all about the Egyptian ideas about the afterlife. They did a mummification project, in which they mummified a hot dog. They then created Egyptian tombs making pyramid and sphinx models to house their hot dogs for two weeks! In Religion, the 6th Graders are continuing their journey through the old testament. Right now they are learning about the fathers of the faith. Reading and writing about Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

7th Grade is off and traveling around the world! They explored Antarctica by learning about the landscape, vegetation, climate and animals. They just completed traveling through Japan and the Koreas, looking at their culture, economy, landscape, economy and government. In Religion the 7th Graders are learning about the Creed and how it expresses our Catholic beliefs. Currently we are working on the second major point of the Creed, Jesus. Students are learning how Jesus was both a man and divine. Soon they will take a look at what it would be like if Jesus were to be among us in today's world.

8th Grade has been learning about the foundation of the United States. They have been focusing on the executive branch. They learned the election process and what it takes to become the president. They held a school wide mock election about St. Joseph's official type of potato. Fries won as the favorite by a landslide. The students just finished an activity in which they ranked the presidents by whom they thought was the #1 President in history. Abraham Lincoln was ranked #1 as the 8th graders choice for top President. In religion they have been exploring the history of the Church. Recently they looked at monasteries and convents. Students didn't think they could make it without talking regularly. Plus they went to bed and woke up way too early for a middle schooler. Now we are going to look at the crusades and what exactly they were all about!
