

Stay ahead of lead

Lead exposure can make it hard for children to leam, pay attention, and behave. Most children with lead poisoning do not look or act sick. The best way to determine if a child is impacted by lead is with a simple blo

Test children at 1 and 2 years, or test once between 2-6 years.

Where can children be tested?

Tests can be conducted by your child's pediatrician or through participation in an eligible program (e.g. Special Supplemental Nutrition Program) for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).


