Drop-Off & Pick-Up

We look forward to seeing you on the first day of school. Here is a reminder of our drop-off and pick-up procedure.

- 1. Bus Students taking the bus will be dropped off between 8:00 & 8:15. After school, they will be supervised in the bus line located by the elementary wing doors.
- 2. Car Line Parents may use the car pick-up line to stay in their car and drop off and pick up their child along the cones. Please do not park under the canopy. *This is the preferred method in the morning, as it makes it much easier on the little ones who sometimes have a hard time letting go. Parents of children requiring a carseat must pull their car all the way up to the cones closest to the basketball hoops if they need get out of the car to buckle or unbuckle their child.
- 3. Sidewalk Parents may park in the parking spaces on the <u>east side</u> of the parking lot and <u>walk along the sidewalk</u> <u>by the church</u> to drop off or gather their child by the playground. For the safety of everyone, do not walk in front of or between the cars in the pick-up line.
- 4. Middle School Only Option Middle School Students may walk to the far end of the sidewalk past the church and meet their parent/guardian at their parked car in one of the designated parking spots on the far east side of the parking lot. This applies only to Middle School Students who do not have a younger sibling.

Please remember, students are not allowed to play on the playground after school unless they are supervised by their parent/guardian.



IMMUNIZATION REMINDER

All updated immunization records are due by 10/1/25 to the school office

(If your child has an appointment after this date, please call the School Office)

All immunization records must be up to date for all students by the start of the school

year. Please call the school office if your child received a shot over the summer so we can update their file. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services does an annual review of all student records. Please don't wait to make an appointment to have your child immunized.



Weekly Classroom Highlights

September Update: Building a Strong Foundation in ELA and Social Studies

The month of September in ELA and Social Studies has been all about preparing for success in middle school. We have focused on building strong academic habits and practicing the skills that will carry students through the rest of the year.

ELA

- 5th/6th Grade: Students have been learning how to annotate as they read, which encourages them to think more deeply and engage with the text. They are also practicing RACE responses (Restate, Answer, Cite evidence, Explain), which help them write full, thoughtful answers that are supported with evidence from the text.
- 7th/8th Grade: Students have been creating vision boards to set personal and academic goals for the year. This project gives them a chance to reflect on what they want to achieve and provides a visual reminder to keep them motivated throughout the school year.

Social Studies

Across all grades, students are learning and practicing the core skills they need to

become strong history learners. These include:

- Asking thoughtful questions
- Identifying and evaluating different types of sources
- Analyzing evidence and making claims
- Practicing chronological thinking
- Understanding that history is interconnected and does not happen in isolation
- Summarizing texts to build comprehension and simplify complex ideas

These activities are not only helping students learn history but also developing critical thinking and literacy skills that transfer across subjects.

Looking Ahead

September has been a month of building habits and setting expectations. All of this practice is laying the groundwork for a successful year in middle school. I am excited to see the growth, discoveries, and learning that will continue to happen in our hallway as the year progresses!

What is Student of the Month?

The SJPS staff is so proud of our students and would like to recognize those who go above and beyond. The faculty and staff will celebrate our incredible students this year through the *Student of the Month Program* Each month, one nominee will be chosen from each level: Early Childhood (K3-K5), Elementary (1st grade - 4th grade), and Middle School (5th grade - 8th grade). When the students are chosen, they will receive a sign to put in their yard, be announced

☐ September Character Trait: KINDNESS

What It Means:

Kindness is showing care, compassion, and respect toward others through words and actions. It means being helpful, inclusive, and thoughtful—without expecting anything in return.

How Students Demonstrate Kindness:

- Greeting classmates and staff with a smile or kind words
- Helping a peer without being asked (e.g., picking up dropped items, explaining directions)
- Including others in group activities or play
- Complimenting others sincerely
- Listening when others are speaking and showing empathy
- Using polite language consistently (please, thank you, excuse me)
- Standing up for someone who is being left out or treated unfairly
- Showing appreciation to teachers, peers, and staff

How Parents Can Support at Home:

- Talk about what kindness looks like in everyday life
- Encourage children to share kind acts from their day
- Read books or watch shows that promote empathy and compassion
- Model kind behavior in your own interactions
