

Weekly Classroom Highlights

A Creative Start to the School Year in the Art Room

The art room has been buzzing with creativity and curiosity from our youngest learners to our middle school artists. Each grade level has explored projects that not only develop their artistic skills but also deepen their understanding of themselves, their communities, and the world around them.

Our early childhood artists embraced the joy of creativity by focusing on friendship and self-expression. Through engaging read-alouds like *Artish* by

Peter H. Reynolds and *The Crayon Box That Talked* by Shane DeRolf, illustrated by Michael Letzig, students learned that everyone is an artist and that our unique differences make our creative community stronger.

The K5 students extended these ideas by exploring the concept of place and belonging. After watching a read-aloud of *My Map Book* by Sara Fanelli, students created their own abstract maps of their communities — focusing on their homes and families. We also discussed the difference between an author and an illustrator and learned how to identify each role when reading a book.

In elementary school, we kicked off the year by exploring the themes of identity and memory. Students learned how artists use their work to tell personal stories — studying David Hockney's photo collages and experimenting with their own Polaroid memory pieces. We also looked at Jake Patterson's work and discovered how something as simple as an emoji can communicate feelings and experiences.

In middle school, we dove right into building a strong foundation for the year ahead. Students reviewed the seven elements of art — line, shape, color, value, form, texture, and space — and then applied their knowledge to a comprehensive project that combined all of them into one piece. We've now shifted our focus to the principles of design, starting with balance. To explore this concept, students are designing stained glass-inspired windows that incorporate holy symbols, transforming simple picture frames into meaningful works of art.

No matter the age or project, the art room continues to be a space where students learn to think creatively, express themselves boldly, and see the world through an artist's lens.








Monday from 6:00 to 7:00pm 12 week session, starting October 20th

Rainbows is a free, 12-week program offered by Ozaukee Family Services for children and adolescents (grades K-12) who are experiencing major family changes such as divorce or the death of a loved one. The program provides a safe and supportive environment where children can express their feelings, build self-esteem, and develop healthy coping strategies.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Small, age-based groups where children connect with peers facing similar challenges.



 Compassionate and trained facilitators who create a trusting and confidential space.

 A concurrent support group for parents to help navigate family changes together.

WHY RAINBOWS?

This program helps children and teens understand their emotions, feel less alone, and develop resilience as they adjust to life's transitions.

Rainbows provides a "rainbow after the storm," guiding children toward heating and hope.

PROGRAM DETAILS

Duration: 12 weeks | October 20, 27 November 3, 10, 17, 24 December 1, 8, 15 January 5, 12, 19(final session) (If Rainbows needs to be canceled due to inclement weather, we will have our final session on January 26th.)

SAFETY REMINDER

A gentle, yet firm reminder to all families who utilize Extended Care in the mornings or afternoons as we have received complaints from the community:

- 16th Avenue, the road that the doors of Extended Care open out to, is a ONE-WAY street. You MUST enter right off of Highway 60 on the north s
 - right off of Highway 60 on the north side of the school and park in the angled parking spots.
- You may NOT drive the WRONG direction and enter from the south roadway. You will be ticketed by GPD if caught doing so.



For the safety of students, families and residents, please follow posted traffic signs.

Drop-Off & Pick-Up

We look forward to seeing you on the first day of school. Here is a reminder of our drop-off and pick-up procedure.

- 1. Bus Students taking the bus will be dropped off between 8:00 & 8:15. After school, they will be supervised in the bus line located by the elementary wing doors.
- 2. Car Line Parents may use the car pick-up line to stay in their car and drop off and pick up their child along the cones. Please do not park under the canopy. *This is the preferred method in the morning, as it makes it much easier on the little ones who sometimes have a hard time letting go. Parents of children requiring a carseat must pull their car all the way up to the cones closest to the basketball hoops if they need get out of the car to buckle or unbuckle their child.
- 3. Sidewalk Parents may park in the parking spaces on the <u>east side</u> of the parking lot and <u>walk along the sidewalk</u> <u>by the church</u> to drop off or gather their child by the playground. For the safety of everyone, do not walk in front of or between the cars in the pick-up line.
- 4. Middle School Only Option Middle School Students may walk to the far end of the sidewalk past the church and meet their parent/guardian at their parked car in one of the designated parking spots on the far east side of the parking lot. This applies only to Middle School Students who do not have a younger sibling.

Please remember, students are not allowed to play on the playground after school unless they are supervised by their parent/guardian.
